Introduction

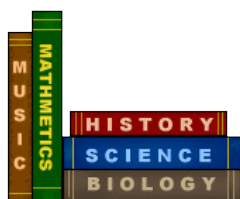

About this School

Arroyo High School is one of five comprehensive high schools in the El Monte Union High School District. It was established in 1955 and located in the beautiful San Gabriel Valley. Its first graduating class was the class of 1958. The school is now in its 55th year of operation. Graduates of Arroyo can be found in various professions, ranging from college presidents to academy awards winners. Arroyo High School is approximately 12 miles northeast of the Los Angeles Civic center and encompasses 40 acres. The city of El Monte has a population of approximately 121,791.

Arroyo provides a variety of programs and courses to meet the needs of its diverse student population of 2,310. Advance Placement (AP), Honors, English Language Learners (ELL), and Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) are a few of the courses designed to meet these needs. Along with academics, students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities. Arroyo offers an array of co-curricular programs such as a nationally recognized National Honor Society and Key Club, Academic Decathlon, choirs, bands, drama performances, 45 clubs and athletic programs. Arroyo's student population of 2,310 consists of 64 percent Title 1 and 18 percent English Language Learners. Arroyo has sustained an over all graduation rate of at least 91%.

Arroyo has been bestowed with many honors and recognitions, not limited to but including Olympic Medalist, Merit Finalists, and National Association of Secondary School Principals Breakthrough High School in 2005. Arroyo High School was recognized by US World News Report, as being one of the best 600 high schools in the nation.
