Introduction

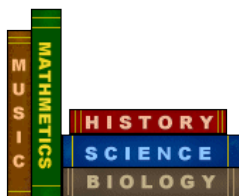

About this School

El Monte High School is an ethnically diverse high school located in the San Gabriel Valley twelve miles east of downtown Los Angeles. Established in 1901, El Monte is one of the oldest schools in Los Angeles County. As of the 2010 census, the city had a total population of 113,475, down from 115,965 at the 2000 census. As of 2010, El Monte is the 228th largest city in the United States, and is the 51st largest city in California.

The mascot name, Lions, was given to the school due to its proximity to Gay's Lion Farm, a popular attraction during the early part of the century. The only remnant of the lion farm is the beautiful sculptured lion that proudly guards the front entrance to the school.

The majority of the school's 1,921 student body population comes from the city of El Monte, but a number of students reside in the adjacent community of South El Monte. Recent data indicate that El Monte has a population of 113,475. The median income for a household in the city was \$32,439 well below the State median household income of \$58,931 in California. El Monte ranks among the lowest income communities in the San Gabriel Valley. Like most areas of Southern California, the median home price has increased sharply over the past several years to \$445,000 while the median rent has remained around \$992 per month. While Latinos make up the majority of students at the school at 80%, the Asian population, primarily composed of Chinese and Vietnamese students, has steadily increased over the past decade to 17%. The overall school population has grown by nearly 20% in that time. About 84% of the student body is economically disadvantaged and qualifies for the federal free lunch program. Almost 40% are identified as English learners. The average parent has not completed high school.

School Facilities - 2011-12

Summary of the Most Recent Site Inspection:

The district takes great efforts to ensure that all schools are clean, safe, and functional. To assist in this effort, the district uses a facility survey instrument developed by the State of California Office of Public School Construction. The results of this survey are available at the school and/or the district office.

The latest site inspection was held on December 30, 2011. With the possibility of an overall rating of exemplary, good, fair, or poor, the overall rating for El Monte High School was good. Based on the field observation the following deficiencies were found.

Repairs Needed:

- ◆ Two rooms HVAC down.
- ◆ Several rooms need paint, plaster and stucco patching, ceiling tiles replaced, and carpet replaced.
- ◆ Several rooms have old clocks, lights out, exposed electrical wire, bad ballasts and vent hood not working.
- ◆ Resource center-toilet does not flush; hallway-drinking fountain broken; staff RR-floor drains clogged.
- ◆ Cafeteria, room 65-smoke detector has cover on it; room 65-fire pull bar tripped; room 82 door blocked; hallway-sprinkler cover missing.
- ◆ Electrical storage-roof leak/patch; room 46-leak in office ceiling
- ◆ Cafeteria-doors need paint; rooms 42, 90-needs weather stripping; room 90-broken door closure.

Corrective Actions Taken:

When deficiencies are found the district takes the appropriate action to make all repairs in a timely fashion through the district's work order system.
