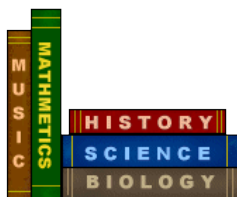
Introduction

About this School

Mountain View High School is located in the City of El Monte, California. El Monte, "The End of the Santa Fe Trail," is situated 12 miles east of Los Angeles. Mountain View High School, one of five comprehensive high schools in the El Monte Union High School District, serves students from the cities of El Monte and South El Monte. Mountain View High School opened its doors in the fall of 1971. The need for a new high school developed in the late 1960s as the student population grew in the cities of El Monte and South El Monte. The community of southeastern El Monte now, for the first time, had a high school of its own.

Mountain View High School has been proactive in developing programs to meet the needs of its diverse population. Courses designed for students range from English Language Learners (ELL), Title 1 programs for English and Math, Advanced Placement (AP) program, Special Education, Career Technical Education classes, and Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID). Our California Partnership Academies (CPA) include *Viking Information System Telecommunications Academy* (VISTA), *Teacher Preparation Academy* (TPA) and the *Green Academy*. Programs to further assist students include Harvey Mudd Upward Bound, PCC Upward Bound, Cal-SOAP, GEAR-UP, and PREP/Learn. Tutoring and extended library hours are available after school four days a week. Students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Mountain View provides a wide variety of clubs, organizations, performing arts programs and athletic teams.
